Identify advantages	Revises wording of measurement to be consistent with wording in Policy 1 so details of the exception review procedure may be removed from Policy 1. Also, Clarifies certain aspects of the procedure and adds a new component measurement, E-M10, which provides for Transmission Owner request for a review to remove its own exceptions. Also, removes the statement about the NYISO revising the exceptions list since the NYSRC is responsible for maintaining the exceptions list and the NYISO is expected to remove the list from its manuals and replace it with a link to the NYSRC list.

Measurement(s)	<p>E-M9:</p> <p>The NYISO shall annually review the at least annually the list of exceptions to the NYSRC Reliability Rules granted under NYSRC Policy 1, <i>Procedure for Reviewing, Developing, Modifying, and Disseminating NYSRC Reliability Rules, as follows:-</i></p> <p>1. The is NYISO shall review shall verify <u>at least annually</u> that the basis for each exception is still valid, including or whether the exception is still required due to changes in grid configuration or conditions, but not to question the original justification for the exception. The NYISO shall notify the NYSRC after the NYISO when it has determined that an exception is no longer valid or required <u>applicable</u> and document the reasons for such its determination why. If the NYSRC concurs with the NYISO's determination, the exception will be removed</p>

~~and the NYISO and NYSRC will revise their list of exceptions accordingly. The NYISO shall revise the list of exceptions after the NYISO receives agreement from the NYSRC on the results of its review. (E-C-R10)~~

E-M10:

2. The NYISO shall review written requests made at any time by a Transmission Owner to remove any of the Transmission Owner's may request at any time, in writing, a review by the NYISO for removal of any of its current exceptions. The NYISO shall notify the NYSRC within five business days of such Transmission Owner request. Within 360 calendar days of receiving the Transmission Owner request, the NYISO shall notify the NYSRC of any adverse reliability impacts that would result from the removal of the exception and whether the NYISO agrees with the Transmission Owner that the exception should be removed. The NYSRC shall determine whether the exception should be removed, giving due consideration to any reliability impacts identified by the NYISO. The NYISO and NYSRC will then revise their list of exceptions accordingly. (E-R10)
