Clarifies certain aspects of the procedure and adds a new component which provides for Transmission Owner request for a review to remove its own exceptions. Also, removes the statement about the NYISO revising the exceptions list since the NYSRC is responsible for maintaining the exceptions list and the NYISO is expected to remove the list from its manuals and replace it with a link to the NYSRC list.

The NYISO shall notify the NYSRC within fiveten business days of such an Applicant's request and a timeframe for the NYISO to perform any appropriate studiesan assessment of the request.- The NYISO shall notify the NYSRC of the results of its assessment and after the NYISO, having completed its process, has determined and exception is no longer valid, required, or needs to be modified and document the reasons for suchits determination, including any adverse reliability impacts within five business days of such Transmission Owner request. Within 60 ealendar days of receiving the Transmission Owner request, the NYISO shall notify the NYSRC of any adverse reliability impacts that would result from the removal of the exception and whether the NYISO agrees with the Transmission Owner that the exception should be removed.
