Clarifies certain aspects of the procedure and adds a new component which provides for Transmission Owner request for a review to remove its own exceptions. Also, removes the statement about the NYISO revising the exceptions list since the NYSRC is responsible for maintaining the exceptions list and the NYISO is expected to remove the list from its manuals and replace it with a link to the NYSRC list. <a href="#">Adds measurement E-M10 which provides for obtaining new exceptions.</a>

	<p><b>E-M9:</b></p> <p>The NYISO shall review the exceptions to the NYSRC Reliability Rules granted under NYSRC Policy 1, <i>Procedure for Reviewing, Developing, Modifying, and Disseminating NYSRC Reliability Rules</i>, as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The NYISO shall verify at least annually that the basis for each exception is still valid, including whether the exception is still required due to changes in grid configuration or conditions. The NYISO shall notify the NYSRC after the NYISO has determined that an exception is no longer valid or required and document the reasons for such determination <a href="#">including NYISO's assessment that there would be no adverse impact to reliability upon removal of the exception.</a></li> <li>2. The NYISO shall review written requests</li> </ol>

	<p>made at any time by a Transmission Owner to <u>modify or</u> remove any of the Transmission Owner's current exceptions. The NYISO shall notify the NYSRC within five business days of such Transmission Owner request. Within 60 calendar days of receiving the Transmission Owner request, the NYISO shall notify the NYSRC of any adverse reliability impacts that would result from the <u>modification or</u> removal of the exception and whether the NYISO agrees with the Transmission Owner that the exception <u>should can</u> be removed. (E-R10)</p> <p><u>E-M10:</u></p> <p><u>Requests to obtain exceptions to the Reliability Rules shall be submitted by the NYISO (or any member of the NYSRC Executive Committee) to the NYSRC Executive Committee for approval, in accordance with the procedures for obtaining an exception as described in NYSRC Policy 1, Procedure for Reviewing, Developing, Modifying, and Disseminating NYSRC Reliability Rules. All requests to the NYSRC for obtaining exceptions shall be accompanied by supporting documentation as described in Policy 1.</u></p>
