Identify advantages	Clarifies certain aspects of the procedure and adds new components which address requests by Transmission Owners for obtaining new exceptions to the Reliability Rules or for a review to remove or modify its own current exceptions. Also, removes the statement about the NYISO revising the exceptions list since the NYSRC is responsible for maintaining the exceptions list and the NYISO is expected to remove the list from its manuals and replace it with a link to the NYSRC list.
Identify disadvantages	None.
6. Measurement(s)	E-M9: The NYISO shall implement actions required for granting new exceptions or modifying or removing current exceptions, as described in NYSRC Policy 1, <i>Procedure for Reviewing, Developing, Modifying, and Disseminating NYSRC Reliability Rules</i>. These required NYISO actions shall include:

Request each Transmission Owner, at least annually, to review its exceptions and to determine whether it wishes to request the NYSRC to grant a new exception or modify or remove a current exception. <li data-bbox="646 791 1200 816">2. Implement a notification from the NYSRC to review a request it has received from a Market Participant to grant a new exception or modify or remove a current exception. Following its review, the NYISO shall notify the NYSRC if it recommends that the NYSRC approve the granting of the new exception, or whether the current exception should be removed or modified as proposed. The NYISO shall document the reasons for its recommendation, including an assessment that there would be no adverse impact to reliability upon issuance of the new exception or removal or modification of the current exception. If the NYISO recommends that the exception request should be rejected by the NYSRC, the

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	NYISO shall document its reasons for such a recommendation
7. Full Compliance Statement <i>(Replaces present E-M9 Compliance Statement)</i>	<p>The NYISO shall initiate certain actions that are required for implementing the NYSRC process of granting new exceptions or modifying or removing current exceptions (“exception changes”), in accordance with E-M9, as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Request each Transmission Owner, at least annually, to review its exceptions and determine whether it wishes to request the NYSRC to grant exception changes, per E-M9.1. 2. In accordance with NYSRC requests, review Transmission Owner proposals for exception changes, and notify the NYSRC of the results of its reviews on a timely basis, per E-M9.2.
8. Levels of Non-Compliance <i>(Replaces present E-M9 Non-Compliance Statements)</i>	
Level 1	During a calendar year, the NYISO did not request Transmission Owners to review their exceptions to determine whether they wish to request exception changes.
Level 2	N.A.
Level 3	Following a request by the NYSRC, the NYISO did not review a proposed exception change and provide the NYSRC with the results of its review on a timely basis.

11. Implementation Plan	E-M9 requirements in PRR 105 shall be implemented by the NYISO immediately following Executive Committee adoption of E-M9 and Policy 1-5 revisions. The NYISO shall certify at the RCMS meeting following E-M9 adoption that it has implemented these requirements.

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 The NYISO shall annually review exceptions to the NYSRC Reliability Rules granted under NYSRC Policy 1, *Procedure for Reviewing, Developing, Modifying, and Disseminating NYSRC Reliability Rules*. This review shall verify that the basis for each exception is still valid. The NYISO shall notify the NYSRC when it has determined that an exception is no longer applicable and document the reasons why. The NYISO shall revise the list of exceptions after the NYISO receives agreement from the NYSRC on the results of its review.

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
