



### 2025 NYSRC Member Fee Review

The first budget was set in November 1999 for the year 2000 at \$550,000. The member fee was set at \$5,000.00 for 2000 in November 1999.

The member fee had no correlation to the budget.

Per the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics \$5,000 in November of 1999 has the same buying power now as \$9,597.39 or ~92% increase. The average CPI from 2000 to present is 2.39%.

Below is a table to illustrate some member fee options:

The budget for the NYSRC from 2000-2026 has increased by 70%.

Some items to consider:

- Has the NYSRC increased the value of membership?

- Are there more working groups than back in 1999?

- Is the NYSRC submitting more comments to FERC, NERC, and State requests for input?

- Are members participating in studies with other agencies more?

Suggestion: There should be a member review and discussion fee every 5 years.
