Section B – Requirements</b>	<p><b>R1.</b> The NYISO shall implement actions required for granting <del>new exceptions</del><u>New Exceptions, —or—</u> modifying or removing current <del>exceptions</del><u>Exceptions (Exception Changes), or the expiration of current Exceptions,</u> as described in NYSRC Policy 1, Procedure for Reviewing, Developing, Modifying, and Disseminating NYSRC Reliability Rules:</p> <p><b>R1.1.</b> Each Transmission Owner shall be requested, at least annually, to assess its <u>Exceptions</u>, and to determine whether it wishes to request the NYSRC to grant a <u>New Exception, an Exception Change, or a one-time extension for any Exception with an expiration date that would otherwise cause the Exception to expire within the next twelve months</u><del>new exception or modify or remove a current exception.</del></p> <p><b>R1.2.</b> The NYISO shall process requests from the NYSRC to review applications for a <u>New Exception, Exception Change or the one time extension of an expiring Exception</u><del>new exception or the renewal or modification of a current exception</del> that:</p>

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The NYSRC has received directly from a <i>Market Participant</i> or,</li> <li>• The NYSRC has received from a <i>Transmission Owner</i> via the Annual Exception Review.</li> </ul> <p><b>R1.3.</b> Following its review pursuant to R1.2, the NYISO shall notify the NYSRC if it recommends that the NYSRC approve the granting of the <u>New Exception, Exception Change or whether or whether an Exception that includes an expiration date should receive a one-time extension up to 18 months from the date initially approved by the NYSRC</u><del>new exception, or whether the current exception should be removed or modified as proposed</del>. The NYISO shall document the reasons for its recommendation, including a finding that there would be no adverse impact to <i>reliability</i> upon issuance of the <u>New Exception, Exception Change, or one-time extension of the expiration date</u><del>new exception or removal or modification of the current exception</del>. If the NYISO recommends that the <u>Exception request</u><del>Request</del> should be rejected by the NYSRC, the NYISO shall document its reasons for such a recommendation.</p>
<b>8. Section C – Compliance Elements</b>	
1. Measures	<p><b>M1.</b> The NYISO initiated required actions for implementing the NYSRC process of granting <u>New Exceptions, Exception Changes, or the one-time extension of the expiration date of an expiring Exception</u><del>new exceptions or modifying or removing current exceptions (“exception changes”)</del>, in accordance with R1, as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Requested each <i>Transmission Owner</i>, at least annually, to review its exceptions and determine whether it wishes to request the NYSRC to grant exception changes, per R1.1.</li> <li>2. In accordance with NYSRC requests, the NYISO reviewed <i>Transmission Owner</i> proposals for <u>New Exception, Exception changes, and/or one-time extension of an expiring Extension</u>, and notified the NYSRC of the results of its reviews and recommendations on a timely basis, per R1.2 and R1.3.</li> </ol>
2. Levels of Non-Compliance	<p><b>2.1 For M1:</b></p> <p>Level 1: During a calendar year, the NYISO did not request <i>Transmission Owners</i> to review their <del>exceptions</del><u>Exceptions</u> to determine whether they wish to request <del>exception</del><u>New Exception, Exception eChanges, or a one-time extension of an expiring Exception</u>.</p> <p>Level 2: Not applicable</p> <p>Level 3: Following a request by the NYSRC, the NYISO did not review and/or provide a recommendation on a proposed exception change and provide the NYSRC with the results of its review on a timely basis.</p> <p>Level 4: Not applicable</p>
